




High in the balmy canopy of a tropical rainforest, resting his damp head on a mango leaf, our champion awakens.




Dew-Drop Dewey rolls from his green bed



to a stream below, where a raft awaits him.




Dewey sails downstream. He sees a family having a picnic.



But the baby is crawling too near the water's edge!




Dew-Drop Dewey jumps onto the shore and alerts the parents; the baby is saved from drowning, and the family thanks Dewey.
