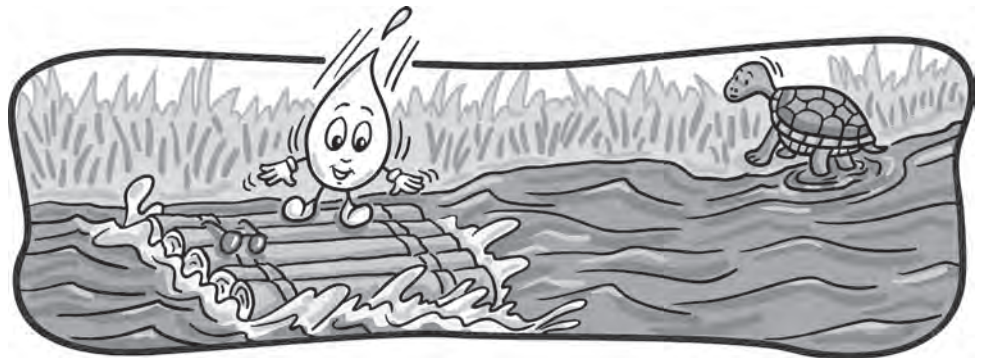
High in the balmy canopy of a tropical rainforest, resting his damp head on a mango leaf, our champion awakens.



Dew-Drop Dewey rolls from his green bed



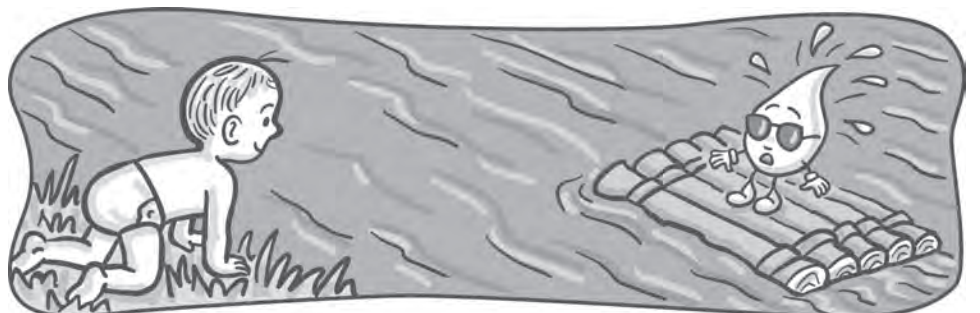
to a stream below, where a raft awaits him.



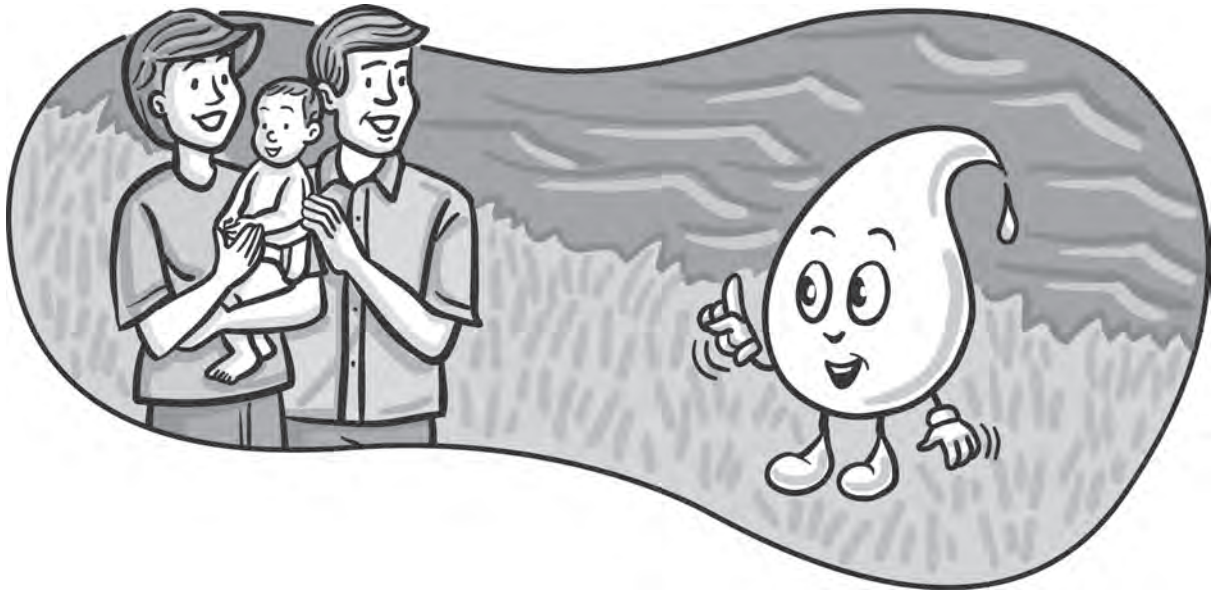
Dewey sails downstream. He sees a family having a picnic.



But the baby is crawling too near the water's edge!



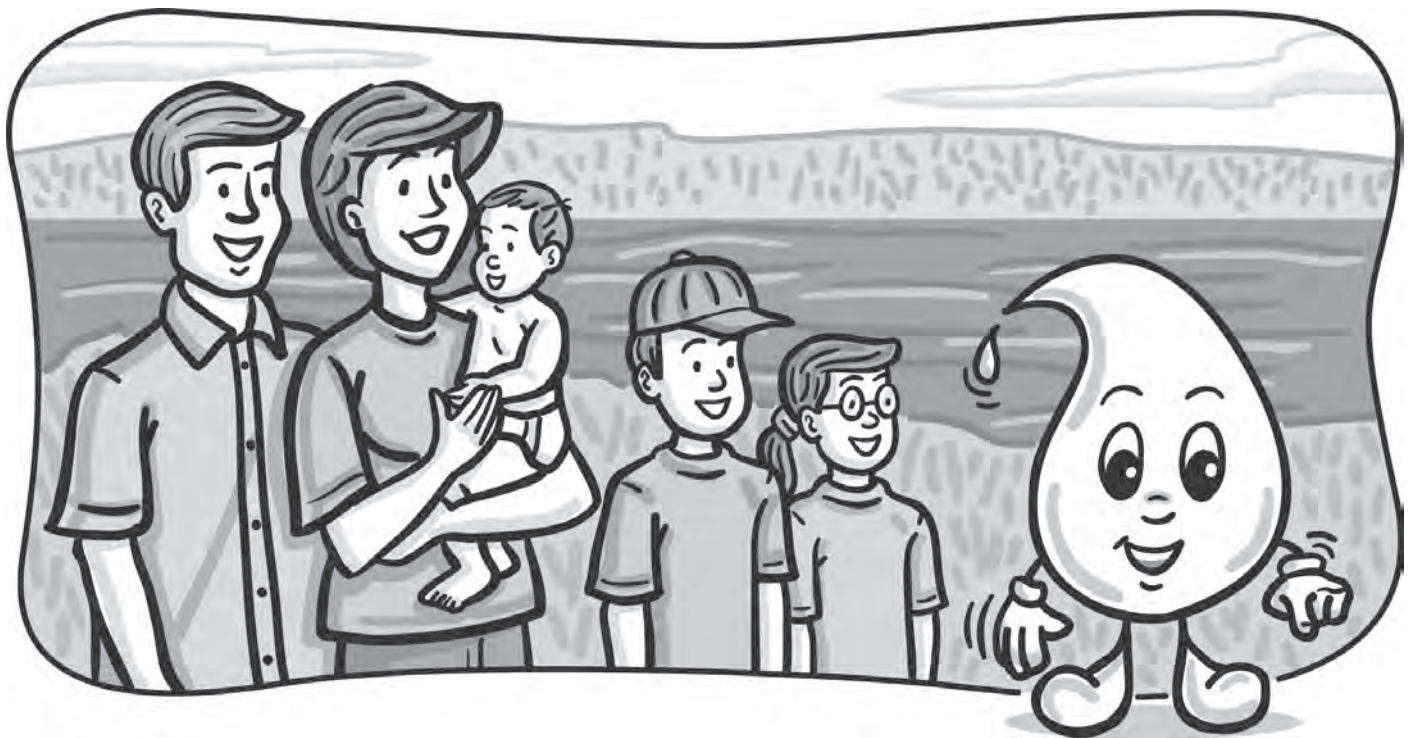
Dew-Drop Dewey jumps onto the shore and alerts the parents; the baby is saved from drowning, and the family thanks Dewey.



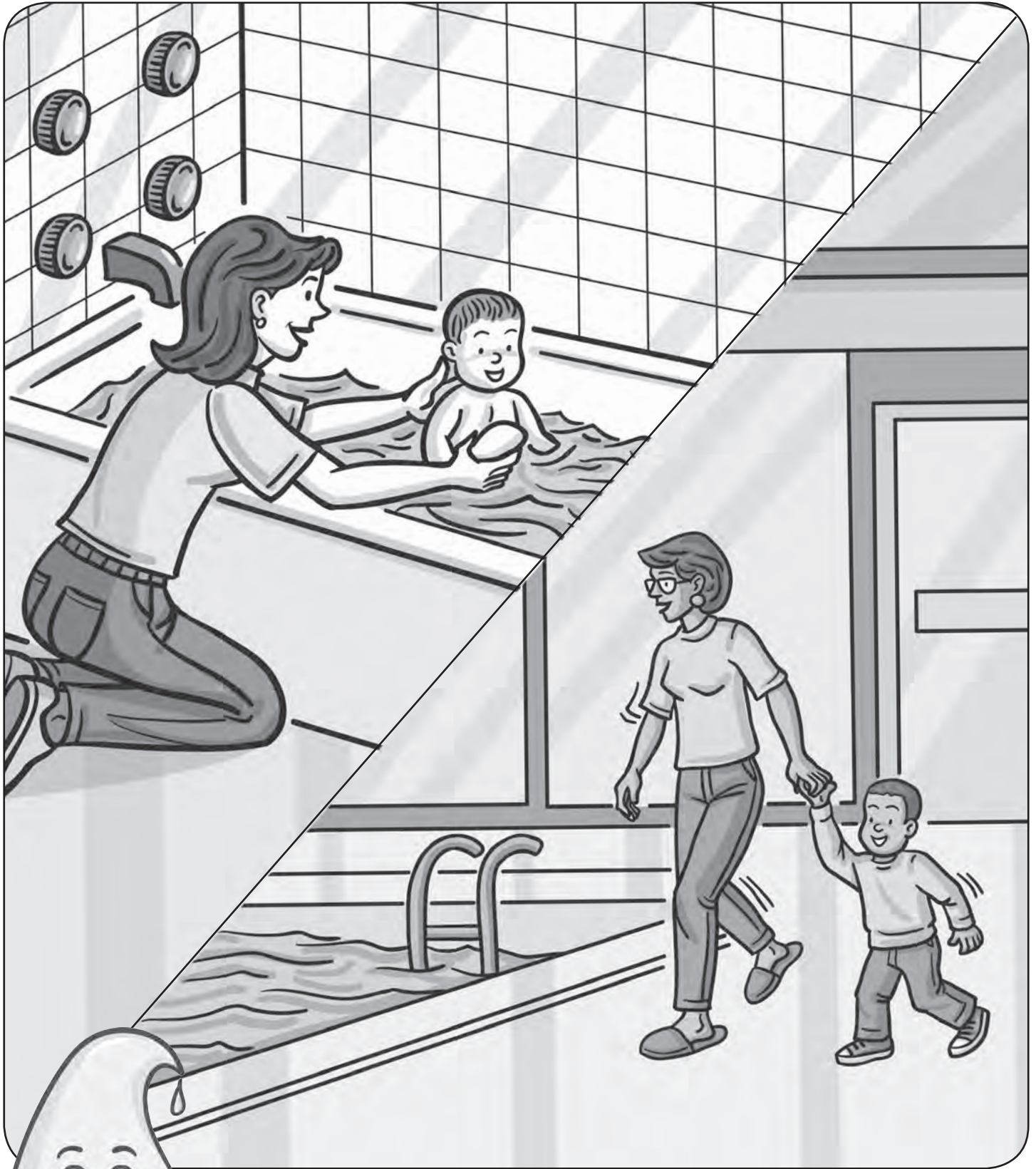
“You’re welcome!” says Dewey. “Now, remember, whenever you’re near water... **put safety first.**”

“How do we do *that*?” asks the mother.

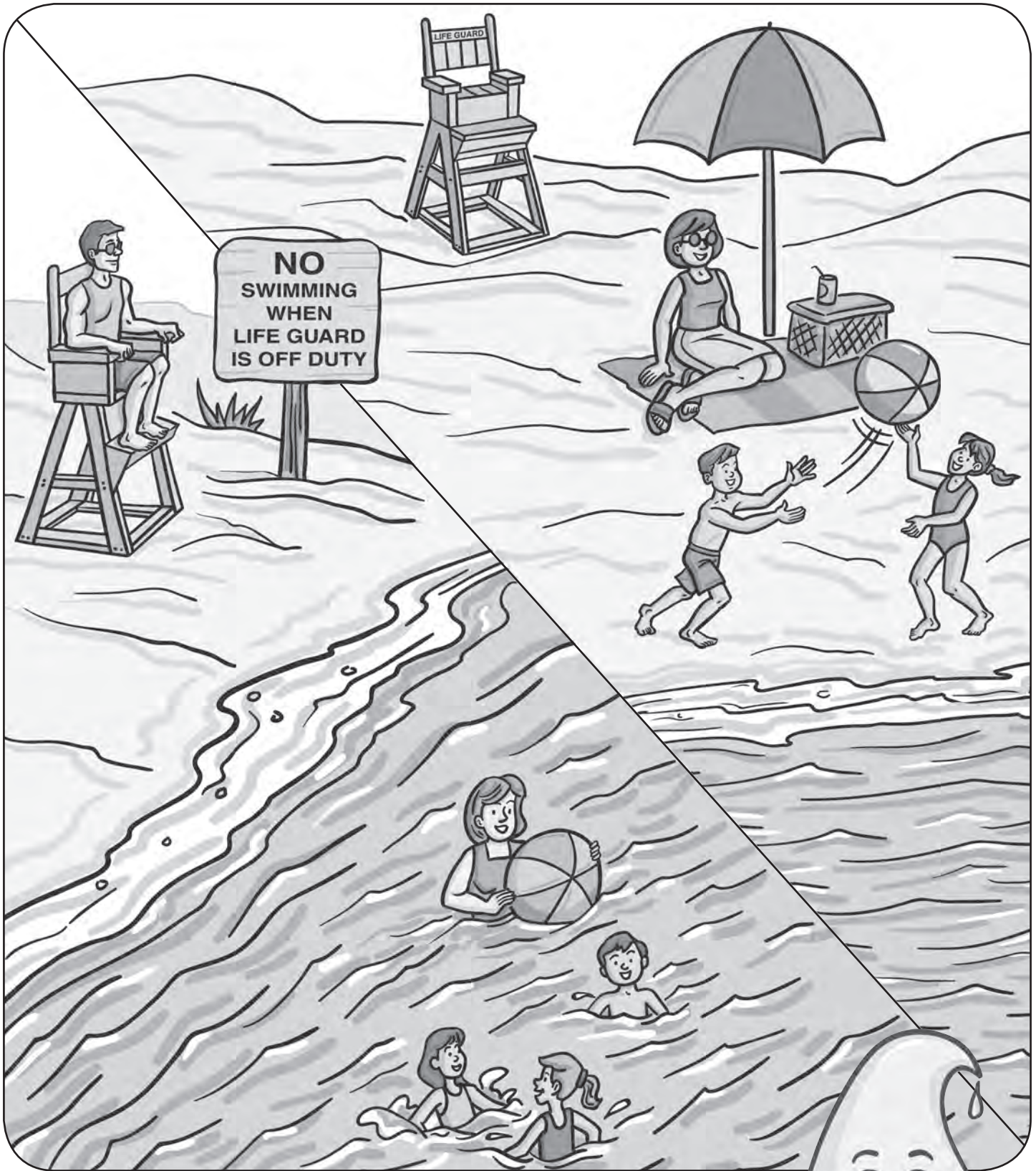
“I’ll show you,” says Dewey...



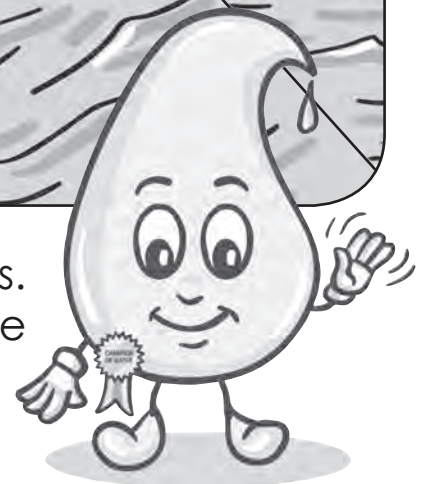
..... “and I’ll show **you**, too!”

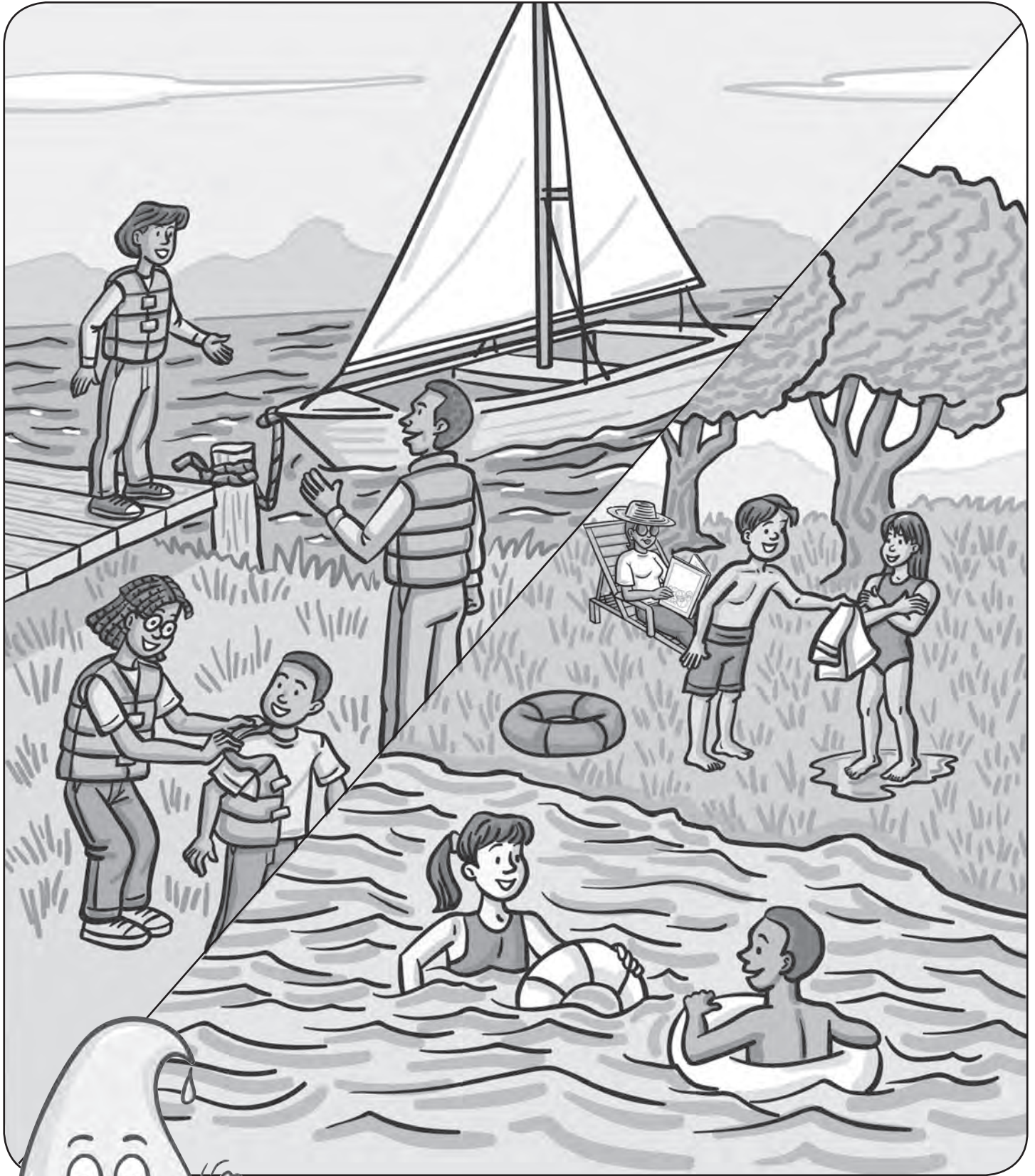


“Adults, always supervise children near water; and children, don’t try to go alone!”
